

Mr. Buddle has arranged for the instrument survey required for the Compact's Exhibit C, and the DEC's version of the contract between the State and the Compact is attached as Exhibit D for your review. This is only a draft, as Attorney Mayer has some concerns over some of the dollar amount language.

I attach Exhibit E showing the property to be used for the project and the "sketch" survey Mr. Buddle has arranged. You will note there are some encroachments; Attorney Mayer and I are working on this and will have more to report in the near future.

While we all are concerned about the New York State Budget problems' impact on our project, the fact that our member item is 95% funded (with the money in the bank), should not cause delays with the State. Senator Kuhl has been advised of our concerns and is following the situation closely.

Mr. Smith of the Corps of Engineers has advised me that the funding with Federal Government is now in place, so the Local Co-operation agreement with the NSA/NYS should follow shortly.

In my opinion, if things continue to move at the existing pace, we will be able to go bid in the Spring of 1991 and then our only hurdle will be one of bids vs. funds in place!

6) Finances

Our CD has matured again and the Penn Yan village clerk has rolled over the principal and taken out the interest for use in paying future attorney's fees. I will have a complete accounting for you at our next meeting.

I close this memo to you on a sad note. R. K. Hull has tendered his resignation as mayor of Penn Yan, effective January 15, 1991. I have been in touch with vice-mayor Robert Mason and will meet with the Village Board on January 21 to review the project. I will keep you all posted on this matter as well. Please feel free to contact me on any issue of concern. I wish you all a happy and prosperous New Year!!

P.S. As I write this report to you, Keuka Lake is a little over 714 feet above sea level; about 2 feet over target, with the gates wide open. When the level begins to recede, it might take 30-60 days to reach the target with no further significant inflows. If we have any significant precipitation between now and May 1st, I see a distinct possibility for serious Spring flooding of the Keuka Shoreline.

No better example exists to show the need for new gates for Keuka Lake!

Dear Mr. Hansen:

Thank you for expressing your views on our Section 205 Flood Control Project at the Keuka Lake Outlet and for participating in the recent inspection of the outlet with Messrs. Michael Smith and Fred Bogleione of my staff. I commend you for the work and dedication that you and members of your organization have shown to enhance and preserve the Keuka Lake Outlet Trail.

With respect to your concern about the potential for induced flooding problems along the outlet, our field inspection confirmed our previous view that the proposed project will not create any greater flooding conditions than presently occur. Your second concern relates to the erosion along the outlet. As suggested by Mr. Allen Buddle of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), NYSDEC will implement a watershed management plan for the tributaries to the outlet to monitor inflows. This will be accomplished during the preparation of the operating manual for the project, after construction is completed. These actions should address both of your concerns.

I trust that this will ease your concerns about possible adverse impacts from the proposed project. My staff will continue to work with you as the project progresses towards construction.

A copy of this letter is being sent to Messrs. Allen Buddle and Richard Konsella of the NYSDEC, and Mr. Bill Weber of the Keuka Lake Compact.
