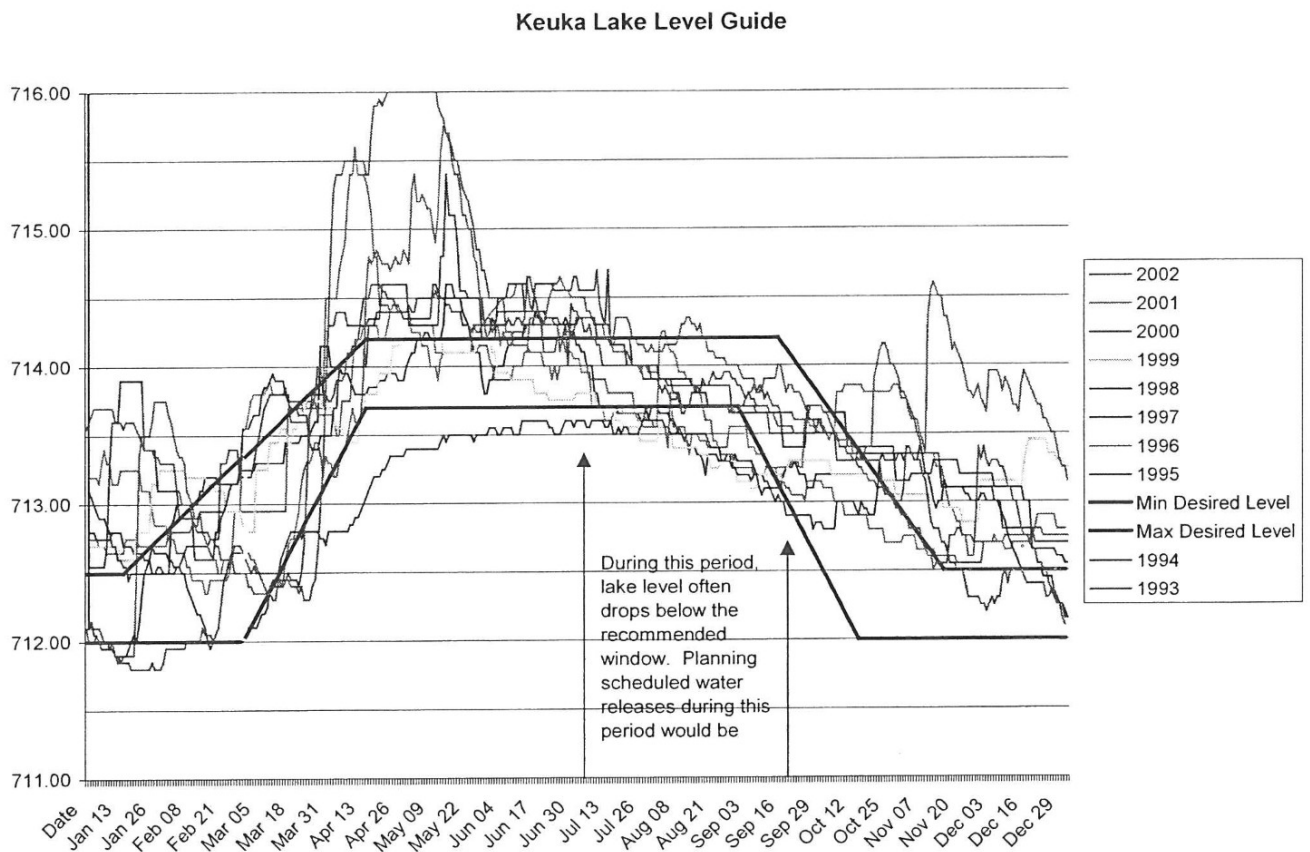


- 5) Organizations considering requesting water releases during July and August for a special event should recognize that during the past 10 years, drought conditions have caused the lake level to drop below the guide window for much of July and August.
- 6) Organizations who request a water release or minimum flow for a special event must also sign a hold harmless waiver. The waiver form can be obtained from the Gate Manager's office. Waiver forms for each participant must be received within three days of the event. (need attorney to work on this)

Estimated Impact on Keuka Lake water levels of a Scheduled Water Release.

400 cfs release for 4 hours=1/7 of inch lower lake level

400 cfs release for 8 hours=1/3 of inch lower lake level

ANDERSEN AND THE YATES CO. COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE EASEMENT QUESTION AND EXAMINE THE ACCESS TO THE GULLY.

GATE MANAGER BALSLEY REPORTED THAT MAYOR MARCHIONDA IS GOING TO GET THE PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE TO WORK WITH THE NYS DEC ON THIS ISSUE.

MANAGER'S REPORT

MR. BALSLEY REVIEWED THE WATER RELEASE PROGRAM AS A DRAFT POLICY STATEMENT. HE REPORTED THAT THERE WILL BE REQUESTS FOR ADDITIONAL RELEASES FOR WATER SPORTS, MONTOUR FALLS ACADEMY FIRE /RESCUE TRAINING, LAKE LEVEL LOWERING AND BASIN FLUSHING. ALL THESE EVENTS BEYOND THE NORMAL GATE OPERATION WILL BE DEALT WITH ACCORDING TO THE SPECIAL EVENT WATER RELEASE PROGRAM.

UPON A MOTION BY COMM DESEYN, SECOND BY COMM. SNOW, THE DRAFT PLAN WAS APPROVED.

COMM. D'IANGIANNI QUESTIONED WHY THE GATES WOULD BE OPERATED FOR ANY REASON OTHER THAN LAKE LEVEL CONTROL.

PETER LANDRE MENTIONED THE ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS GUIDE CURVE/MANUAL AS THE REASON KLOC CAN OPERATE THE GATES UNDER DIFFERENT CIRCUMSTANCES.

LYNDA RUMMEL SPOKE ABOUT THE GENERAL OBLIGATIONS LAW AS PROTECTION AND THE FACT THAT SIGNS WOULD OFFER FURTHER PROTECTION AS WARNINGS TO THE PUBLIC, IN ADDITION TO ANNOUNCED SCHEDULES OF SPECIAL RELEASES.

ART MILLER SPOKE ABOUT THE CANOE ASSOCIATION AND THE ADVISABILITY OF NAMING ADDITIONAL INSURED UP TO \$5MM PER EVENT FOR KLOC.

THE PLAN WAS APPROVED FOR 60 DAYS TO THE NEXT KLOC MEETING SO THAT COMM. D'IANGIANNI CAN REPORT BACK TO THE COMMISSIONERS.
